Clicker Tips

2. SAFELY FEED YOUR HORSE

Practice feeding your horse safely before you introduce the clicker or target.

Start this task with your horse in the stall or behind a fence.

Your goal is to let the horse feel the difference between the BACK of your closed hand and your PALM.

Begin this task with 5 treats. Take a very short break, then practice this again.

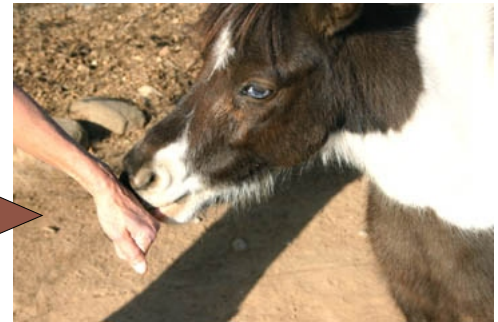

Clicker Tips

2. SAFELY FEED YOUR HORSE

- * FIRST let the horse touch the back of your hand.



- * NEXT wait until he QUILTS searching for the food and pauses.



- * NOW turn your hand over. Feed with a very flat palm and your thumb tucked against your hand.



VERY IMPORTANT TIP
Tuck your thumb in!
